Collaborator Agreement

This document details the agreement between Oxford Trauma at the Kadoorie Institute and HAWAII-DRIFT Collaborators

- Oxford Trauma values the role clinical staff can have in research.
- Oxford Trauma seeks to involve orthopaedic/hand/plastic trainees, ED trainees, specialist nurses, physiotherapists and consultants in all studies where possible.
- Oxford Trauma commits, alongside site staff and R&D departments, to confirm evidence of participation in studies as part of CPD.
- Oxford Trauma intends to name individuals who can demonstrate these criteria as named PubMed collaborators on submitted manuscripts. This will be subject to journal policy. Collaborators will be acknowledged in the primary clinical paper unless otherwise stated.

The criteria for determining an individual's collaborator status are:

Activity	Points	Evidence/ suggestions
Setup	1-3	- Primary HAWAII-DRIFT contact at site - Return SFQ - Site induction visit attendance
GRANULE Course	1	- GRANULE Certificate (available to complete online at NIHR Learn) https://learn.nihr.ac.uk/ and register using an NHS e-mail address.
Consent	2, for each screened and consented	- Signed Consent Form(s)
Training a colleague to recruit	1/colleague (Max 3 points)	- Updated training & delegation logs in REDCap
Associate PI Programme completion	7 points	- NIHR API Certificate

10 points and above – named PubMed collaborator

Note: *It is your responsibility to present evidence to the Trial Team when you accumulate 10 points or more.*
