

## OP Non-STOP: OPerative or NON-Surgical Treatment Of Perthes' disease

## **Collaborator Agreement**

This document details the agreement between Oxford Trauma & Emergency Care (OTEC) and OP Non-STOP Collaborators

- OTEC values the role clinical staff can have in research.
- OTEC seeks to involve orthopaedic trainees, ED trainees, specialist nurses, physiotherapists and consultants in all studies where possible.
- OTEC commits, alongside site staff and R&D departments, to confirm evidence of participation in studies as part of CPD.
- OTEC intends to name individuals who can demonstrate these criteria as named PubMed collaborators on submitted manuscripts. This will be subject to journal policy. Collaborators will be acknowledged in the primary clinical paper unless otherwise stated.
